



# Sources of Strength Oregon: 2023-2024 Mini Grant Information

Schools and organizations implementing Sources of Strength in Oregon can apply for grant funds to support implementation which upon approval, will be spent by **June 30th, 2024**.

See details below for how these allotted funds are able to be used to support the implementation process.

## Who is eligible?

- Any school (elementary, middle, high or college/university), district or ESD, youth-serving organization, Tribal Nation or other organization implementing Sources of Strength.
- Must have an approved implementation form on file with Matchstick Consulting and received training by a Statewide or local Certified trainer.

#### When will mini-grants be available?

Mini-grant application periods will be:

### **Fall Grant Period**

- October 1-31, 2023: Application window is open. Submit your application!
- November 1-2, 2023: Application review period.
- November 3rd, 2023: Applicants notified of funding decision. Payments processed.

#### Winter Grant Period

- January 1-31, 2024: Application window is open. Submit your application!
- February 1-2, 2023: Application review period.
- February 3rd, 2023: Applicants notified of funding decision. Payments processed.

#### What are the reporting requirements?

Grantees will receive a fillable Google form to complete based on the grant they are awarded. In general each grantee will be asked to share:

- A narrative about how the funds were used. Include events, specific campaigns, students reached, etc.
- A description of the impact of the funding.
- Documentation of any campaigns or events must be provided to Matchstick Consulting, including Photos / Videos / Media from an event or campaign that can be used by Matchstick as examples for schools statewide and/or evaluation purposes. Materials that show students' faces would not be shared publicly without permission.

## What is the deadline for reporting?

• Grants reports are due by the end of the school year in which they were received (June 30th)
